PRESENTATION FROM RUSSELL MURRAY – AUSTRALIA LATE 1800'S THE DAWN OF MOTORING.

In the late 1800s, Australia had one of the largest ownerships per capita of bicycles in the world, so when the small internal combustion engine just became available, many of the cycling shops and smart thinkers caught on to the idea of building engines into the cycles, as well as adapting motors into four wheel arrangements and also engines for motorbikes, which came popular because of the scarcity of fuel. One of the first motorbike recorded runs in 1903 was from Melbourne to Tooradin in Victoria. Fuel was needed and had to come by ship because we had no refineries in the early years. Petroleum was an actual brand name which was shortened to petrol and became a generic term and was shipped in kerosene tins and then in larger 44gallon drums with hand pumps. The first company to set up points of sale to trade directly with a motorist was HC Sleigh in 1985, later to be known as Golden Fleece. Then came Standard Oil in 1900, Shell Oil in 1903, and British imperial (BP) in 1905. On the farm, the revolution was also taking place as well with a new workhorse tractor, steam powered or oil, mostly coming from Europe or America, but there were also some locally built tractors in the early days. The first one in Australia was a Petrol-Powered EA in 1908 from a workshop in Melbourne, marking the transition here from steam to fuel. In 1903, some motoring enclosures decided to form a club, the Royal Automobile Club of Australia. (RACA). It was based in Sydney and was formed to encourage the idea of motoring for pleasure. Very much as we and other clubs enjoy the company of like-minded people.

This was also the beginning of rules and regulations. Women were very active in the club from the beginning, in 1906 Mrs. Spencer Nolan was recorded as the first woman to hold a driver's license in New South Wales. And was also one of the founding club members.

The RACA also assumed the control of motor sports until the Confederation of Australian Motor Sports, (CAMS) took over in 1953. Soon after came Clubs from other states with their own organised club runs and with some forward thinkers were able to persuade some country hoteliers to stock cans of fuel so drivers could go beyond the city boundaries. The first long run was from Adelaide to Darwin, in 1908. Charles Brown Kellow, who was a bicycle racer, was Australia's first multi franchise dealer as we know them today, He began in 1903 with the French D Dion Bouton and by 1904 added agencies for Talbot Siddley, Renault, Minerva, Rolls Royce and Albion trucks, and in the 1920's he built Australia's first lavish car showroom. The pneumatic Tyre for bicycles was invention patented by John Boyd Dunlop produced in Dublin and shipped to Australia. Frank Beaurepaire a three-time Olympian who rescued a man from the jaws of Shark at Coogee, was awarded 5000 pounds for his bravery, and used his reward to start his own business retreading tyres forming his company in 1922. To produce brand name Olympic tyres.
