- They MUST be as CLOSE TO ORIGINAL CONDITION as possible, with NO ALTERATIONS except for safety features, such as turn indicators & seat belts, and must be over 30 years old.
- TDAMC Members are permitted to attend events listed In the 'Rusty Relic' Events page, but you will need to carry a copy of the latest magazine or events page with you.

<u>Logbook 60-day scheme</u>: Members that are on the 60-day Logbook Scheme must fill in the booklet for each day's use **if it is not listed in Club Events**.

Logbook must be filled out for maintenance (test runs), rego checks & personal use and carried with you. (If not on logbook scheme you must contact the Secretary for maintenance runs and personal use). See back page for more information

- Mike spoke about a Triumph Herald advertised for Sal at Port Macquarie plus other interesting vehicles and bikes.
- Mike sadly announced the death of long time club member Bruce Barnes on 2/3/25 aged 70. Funeral Tuesday 11am at St Johns Church. Bruce won Australian Championship in go carts. He had a 1964 Cortina, Honda 350 and BSA bikes and previously owned Westside Motorcycles then Southside Motors.

- Greg Reive talked about a website if the club is interested. He has sent a test site to have a look at from a different club. The site can be looked on your phone. https://test.ubeaut.work/

- Report in another club magazine: It was reported that at a previous Gnoo Blas event, a police officer had taken photographs of some HVS registered cars and after subsequent checking of inspection certificates, there were fines issued between \$8,000 and \$12,000. He said there is now discussion around HVS cars being required to correspond with the vehicle's compliance plate for example cars with plates showing six cylinder or bench seats must have six cylinder/bench seat. The message being be aware.

If your HVS vehicle is due for registration within the next 2 months, collect a signed and stamped RMS "Historic Vehicle Declaration 1259 Form" from Val at a meeting or on a club run, or arrange with Val to have it mailed to you. (It must be original so cannot be emailed). Gregg McLean can also stamp and sign off on the 1259 Form (but not doing rego checks).

For **motorcycle Rego checks** Phone Peter Walton on 0414669434 and when passed you will be able to get the 1259 form stamped & signed then, as long as your membership is current. Scott Heatley is doing Rego checks for motorcycles in Werris Creek & Quirindi, also Tamworth when he is in the area Ph 0417445058, as well as Peter Barker Ph 0408963433



Requirements for vehicles/motorcycles on HVS (Historic Vehicle Scheme):

➤ They MUST be as CLOSE TO ORIGINAL CONDITION as possible, with NO ALTERATIONS except for safety features and must be OVER 30 YEARS OLD.

USE OF LOGBOOK: (a new Logbook will only be issued by RMS when your registration is due)

- Logbooks allow up to 60 days use per registration year. They are to be used for maintenance, Rego checks and personal use when out on a public road if it is not listed in TDAMC events.
- The driver's **FULL NAME** and the date must be entered in the Logbook at the start of each day's use. Only one entry per day is required, regardless of how many different drivers or trips taken that day.
- Entries in the Logbook must be in blue or black ink and must be carried in the vehicle when in use.
- ➤ Logbooks must be made available on request by a NSW Police Officer or an Authorised Officer and may be subject to audit.
- ➤ If the allocated 60 days Logbook use is exhausted, the vehicle can ONLY be used for club related events.

IF NOT ON THE LOGBOOK SCHEME maintenance runs need to go in the Day Book held by the secretary, also if attending rallies that are not listed in the magazine a Permit to Move Form is to be filled out.

FOR CLUB EVENTS: you need to carry a copy of the club's magazine or events page.

NOTE: TDAMC members with HVS registered vehicles/bikes <u>must attend at least 3 events per year</u>.

When out on the road on a TDAMC event make sure you abide by the road rules – the driver/rider is responsible if in breach of RMS road rules or in an accident that the driver/rider is at fault.
