<u>Club Meetings:</u> General Meetings are held at the Boambee East Community Centre (30 Bruce King Drive, Boambee East) at 7.00 pm on the first Thursday of each month except for January when no meeting is normally held.

Club Fees: A joining fee of \$5.00 applies. Annual fees are \$45.00 for a Single Membership, \$50.00 for a

Family Membership, \$15.00 for a Junior Membership and \$10.00 for Associate Membership. Fees are due on 1St January each year for the calendar year. However, as membership of an approved car club is an RMS requirement for Concessional Registration of vehicles, annual fees for members seeking registration of cars in the following year are payable at the Rego Day, normally the third Sunday in November. For members joining the Club after 30 June each year, half annual fees will apply.

For an annual fee of \$15.00 (payable to the Treasurer) a member may arrange to have a printed B/W copy delivered by Australia Post to an address of their choice.

July for Jeep

A few months back it was at end of the day when my friend and I decided to visit Lloyd's Auctioneers down Hi-Tech Drive in Toormina to see what interesting cars may be there. Funnily enough, we did see an interesting classic car, which we found out off one of the staff that it was a 1989 Jeep Grand Wagoneer.

Jeep's Concise Story

Jeep was born during the onset of World War II, as the Allies waged war against the Axis, is when Willy's,,in 1943, came up with the brilliant idea to create a small 4×4 that could go practically anywhere. The Willy's Jeep was then used as the United States no.1 military vehicle during the rest of the war and in the postwar years after that.

But It was only after the war when Jeep branched out into the car market and started to explore the idea of cars that could be used by civilians. In 1950 Jeep became a trademark name of Willy's, and started to release their first cars, like the CJ-5. Jeep even started making trucks, like the FC-150 and FC-170.

In the 1962, Jeep released two new cars, these were the Utilitarian Gladiator, and the Luxurious Grand Wagoneer. While the Gladiator would have a shorter runtime and would only be marketed until 1971. However, the Grand Wagoneer would have a very long run indeed, when it was only discontinued in 1991.

After two years since the Grand Wagoneer was discontinued another Jeep model managed to score a role in the movie Jurassic Park as the main security cars. It was the Jeep Wrangler, which started in 1986 and ceased production in 1995. A later, and more modern version has since come out.

Back to 2025, where my friend and I then visited about a week or two later, and found out that the car had been moved to a spot in the showroom, where I managed to get a snapshot of the V8 engine. A later visit and the car was gone. A querie to the staff who informed us that a keen buyer bought the car, which then went to Western Australia. The car supposedly sold in the mid 20 grands.

Vale George Perkins

Members were saddened to learn of the passing of former member George Perkins recently. George was laid to rest in Coffs Harbour on 30th June.

George was an active participant in the club, usually driving his Jaguar and accompanied by his partner, Gloria.

THE FORD FLIVVER

The Ford Flivver was a single seat light aircraft that was built in 1926 at the behest of Henry Ford. His only stipulation was that it be small enough to fit into his office. The just completed first prototype was unveiled on July 30, 1926. It was flown regularly by Ford's chief test pilot, Harry J. Brooks. The tiny aircraft was designed to be "every-man's aircraft" just as Henry's Model T was "every-man's automobile". The Ford Flivver inspired a New York Evening Sun columnist to write a poem about it:

I dreamed I was an angel And with the angels soared But I was simply touring The heavens in a Ford.

Charles Lindbergh was invited to fly one of the prototypes at one point. After his flight he proclaimed the Flivver to be, "one of the worst aircraft he ever flew". Brooks had a Flivver prototype modified so he could try for long distance record for light aircraft. The flight was to be from Dearborn, Michigan to Miami, Florida. He made a forced landing in Titusville, Florida where he repaired a bent prop and then spent the night after which he again set off to continue his flight. While at Titusville he had jammed toothpicks in the vent holes of his fuel cap to prevent condensation from entering the tank overnight. When he left the next morning on his flight he had forgotten to remove them. His Flivver crashed in the ocean off Melbourne, Florida due to fuel starvation due to the blocked air vents. Brooks' body was never found although the aircraft later washed up on shore. Henry Ford was so devastated by the death of a favoured employee that he pulled the plug on development of the Ford Flivver.
